NAG2A(b)(i): *Strengths and identified areas for improvement*

Strengths:

Te Wharekura o Kirikiriroa strengths identified in the findings of the ERO Confirmed Ngā Kitenga Arotake noted the schools localised curriculum - Te Pou-a-Haokai as providing “inspirational guidance for kaupapa Māori pedagogy, high expectations and respectful and reciprocal learning relationships”. The report speaks to the focus on oral language as the basis for student achievement in literacy by stating that “Uri are achieving well at all levels in Pānui and Tuhiwhi” with the developing Wharekura students being “well supported to achieve success”.

The kura continues to set high achievement standards and targets in curriculum areas that are meaningful and important to the kaupapa of the kura, students, their whānau and community. Focus on whānau and student educational priorities is the core strength of Te Wharekura o Kirikiriroa.

Areas for improvement:

Priority areas for improvement in 2025;

1. Strengthening understanding of Te Ara Rewarewa assessment criteria across kaiako and whānau
2. Supporting Te Reo Matatini and Pāngarau support for Kaiako in Te Hihiri and Te Manako

NAG2A(b)(ii): *The basis for identifying areas for improvement*

The development of Te Ara Rewarewa is scheduled to be digitised in 2025. The shift to the Kete Whakairo platform will form the main part of both kaiako and whānau understanding of Te Ara Rewarewa.

Sound Reo Matatini and Pāngarau foundational pūkenga and mātauranga based teaching programmes from Tau 1 – 8 form the basis for the ongoing success of students’ learning and career pathways through their Wharekura years. It is because of this that the kura has identified Tau 4 – 10 as a critical period for transitioning to the newly introduced NCEA Literacy and Numeracy co-requisites.

Strengthening Tau 4 – 10 kaiako capacity further improves the potential for student achievement.

Te Manako Senior Kaiako and Te Wānanga to continue to undertake professional development in the delivery of Standards approved for NCEA Co-requisites during the 2024 – 2027 transition period.

NAG2A(b)(iii): *Planned actions for lifting achievement*

Te Ara Rewarewa as a part of the Kete Whakairo suite of E-Teaching, Learning and Reporting capabilities will improve overall understanding of student success criteria. This is planned to be launched to coincide with the 2025, March 1st benchmarks.

A needs analysis of kaiako capacity will inform the pld and mentoring support required.

Success will be measured by monitoring Reo Matatini and Pāngarau student progress throughout the year. Pou Ārahi will track, monitor and report against targeted outcomes as planned for in the Te Hihiri and Te Manako Rauwaka annual targets and plans.
