NGĀ WĀ TĪMATA, WĀ OTI, WĀ WHAKAWĀTEA I TE KURA

Ka tīmata a Te Rea, Te Pupuke me Te Hihiri a te 8.30am i ia ata, a, ka mutu a te 2.30pm i ia ahiahi. Ka tīmata a Te Manako a te 9:00am, a, ka mutu a te 3:00pm.

Hāunga i ngā tamariki kei te Hōtaka Manaaki, kia kaua a tātou tamariki e tae mai i mua i te 8am, a, kia kaua rātou e noho hipa atu i te 3.30pm. Ka tīmata ngā hui a ngā kaimahi i tēnei wā.

Start times for Te Rea, Te Pupuke and Te Hihiri begin at 8.30am and finish at 2.30pm. Te Manako begin at 9:00am and finish at 3:00pm.

Apart from students on the before and after school programmes, children are not to arrive at school before 8am, and they are to be picked up or have left school by 3.30pm as duty teachers have their rauwaka hui at 3.30pm. For class schedules during the day, please ask your child's kaiako for a timetable.

These values underpin the way in which we take care of our school. They inform and guide the expected professional behaviour of our staff, the expected behaviour of our children and the conduct of any others who come into our school. 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TE HURIHANGA WAKA

E mate anō tātou ki te whakamaumahara i ō tātou mātau, kia kaua e tūngia ngā waka ki te huringahanga waka. Aua take anō rā, ko te haumarutanga a ngā tamariki ka tahi, ko te whakararu i ngā waka e huri haere ana i te hurihanga nei, me te aha, he kūare nā te mea he tohu kei te hurihanga e kī ana:



Me uaua ka kī ake ki ō tātou tamariki, ki ō tātou kaimahi kia whāia ngā ture o te kura, engari tē aro e ngā mātua.

Back to school and are witnessing more and more parents parking on the round about, especially in the mornings when dropping off their children. Another reminder that this is a safety issue. Secondly, stopping on the round about holds up other moving traffic. Finally, there is a sign posted in the center of the round about in both te reo Māori and in English, therefore stopping on the round about is a choice whānau are deliberately making regardless of the safety issues.

Following school rules are expected of students, staff and whānau.

POU ORANGA

Last year, upon the feedback over many years provided to us from parents and whānau, we implemented Te Pou Oranga (Health and Wellbeing) curriculum. One particular part of this curriculum is the physical health and wellbeing programme which consists of physical education and participation.

To this end, participation in physical activities in the pou oranga tinana programme is not optional.

If your child has medical issues or has had a clinic diagnosis by a qualified practitioner, please let their teacher know. An alternative programme will be provided where your child will be able to still participate alongside their peers.
