TUIA TE RANGI E TŪ NEI, KO TE ATUA TŌ TĀTOU PIRINGA KA PUTA KA ORA. TUIA TE TE PAPA E TAKOTO NEI, KO KĪNGI TŪHEITIA KO TE WHARE KĀHUI ARIKI. KA RONGO TE PŌ, KO NGĀ MATE TĀRŪRŪ NUI, KA RONGO TE AO KO TĀTOU TE HUNGA ORA, TUIA TE MUKA HERENGA TANGATA, TIHĒ MAURIORA

NGĀ WHAKATAETAETAE Ā ROHE O TAINUI 2024

Me mihi kā tika kia koutou kaiako mā, akonga mā, tae atu ki tō mātou Tumuaki i tū ki ngā whakataetae kapa haka ā rohe o Tainui i roto i te wikene kua pahure ake nei. Kua rangatira tō mātou whare haka i te kounga o tō koutou tū, tae atu ki ngā whānau whānui o Tainui waka, nei ka mihi atu nei ka mihi atu.

WAEA PŪKORO

Kāore e kore kua paopaotia a tātou taringa i ngā kōrero mō te whakakorehanga o ngā waea pūkoro ki roto i ngā kura. Ehara i te mea he ture hou tēnei ki a tātou, heoi anō e whakatakoto ake nei ko ngā taipitopito whakamaharatanga kei tō tātou kura mō te kawenga mai o ngā waea pūkoro ki te kura. Koia nei ko ngā ture:

1. E kore e whakaaetia ngā waea pūkoro waenga i te 8.30am – 3pm hāunga i ngā āheinga kua whai tautoko.
2. Ki te mau mai he waea pūkoro ki te kura, me tuku ki ngā kaiako i te tīmatanga o te rā, hei mua i te 8.30am.
3. Ka whakahokia ngā waea pūkoro hei te mutunga o te rā.
4. Ki te takahi tētahi i ngā ture nei, ka purita te kaiako mō te toenga o te rā. Mā ngā mātua e tiki mai a te mutunga rā.
5. Ka oti ka whāia te pūnaha Whakatau Whanonga a te kura inā ka hāmeme tētahi.

Ko ngā whatinga ture:

1. Te whakamahi i ngā waea pūkoro i ngā hāora kura e kore e whakaaetia
2. Te whakatuma mā runga ipurangi
3. Te whakaāhua i tētahi kāore anō kua whakaaetia
4. Te tuku haere i ngā whakaahua, kōrero, kiriata tūkino

Ngā āheinga:

- Mō te mahi ako – Mā te kaiako anake e tuku whakaaetanga
- Mō ngā take haumarū, ora – Me whai te ākongā i tētahi pānui e kī ana i te take me te roanga o te āheinga
- He haerenga (EOTC) – Mā te kaiako anake e tuku whakaaetanga

Kia mataara – No te ākongā te kōwhiringa kia haria mai tētahi waea pūkoro ki te kura. Ki te pakaru, te ngaro rānei, ka kore te hāmenetanga ka heke ki runga i te kura.

No doubt we are aware of the Governments expectations around the use of cell phones during school time by students. The kura has always had expectations and rules to ensure that cell phones do not distract students from their learning. Please be advised of these expectations, the rules, exemptions and consequences for breaching the rules.

1. *All student cell phones will not be accessed from 8.30am – 3pm except where exemptions have been permitted*



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2. All cell phones will be handed into class kaiako at the beginning of the school day
3. Kaiako will store cell phones safely and where they can be collected at the end of the day
4. Should ākongā breach the rules, cell phones will be confiscated for the remainder of the day and will need to be collected by parents or caregivers.
5. Should breaches occur, the schools Behaviour Management will determine the next steps in resolution and consequences.

Breaches of the rules include but are not limited to:

1. using the device when not permitted
2. any sort of bullying, including online bullying
3. taking photos or videos of other people without their permission
4. forwarding inappropriate messages or content.

Exemptions:

- Learning activities – Only the teacher can grant permission for students to use their cell phones during learning activities
- Health and Safety Emergencies – Medical certification and / or protection orders must include a time stipulation. These are to be authorised by the tumuaki and managed by the teacher
- Class trips – Only the teacher can grant permission for students to use their cell phones during class trips

Note: Should students decide to bring cellphones to kura, they do so at their own risk. The kura takes no responsibility for any loss or damage caused to any cellphones.

TE TARI AROTAKI - ERO

He whakamaharatanga ki a tātou, ki ngā uara o te kura:

1. Aroha
2. Hūmārie
3. Whakaute
4. Manaakitanga
5. Whakatairanga

Koia nei ko ngā uara e kawē ana i a tātou katoa e puta ana ki waho o te kura. Me he kaupapa-ā-iwi, me he haerenga ā akomanga, me he tākarotanga ā hākinakina, mā tātou, mā ō tātou tamariki ngā uara nei e kawē.

Another reminder of our schools' values:

2. Humility
3. Respect
4. Care
5. Celebration

These are the values in which we expect everyone to abide by, and practise especially when representing the kura at external events. Whether it be a tribal event, a class or school excursion, or any of our sports codes, tamariki, coaches, supporters and whānau should conduct themselves with consideration, humility, respect, care with achievements celebrated in a humble manner.

TE HIHIRI

Kia ora e te whānau, i tēnei wiki i tū ai he whakataetae Mātai Pūhanga EPRO8 mō ngā kura Rāwhiti o Kirikiriroa ki te kura Katorika o Marian. Ko te whāinga o tēnei kaupapa kia wheakotia ngā tamariki ki ngā momo pūkenga me ngā whakaaro Mātai Pūhanga, arā te Engineering. I te ahipō o te Wenerei i pakanga atu te tīma Tau 8, ko Herangi rātou ko Rangihuia, ko Tumarū ko Lorenzo, ki ērā atu o ngā kura i tae atu. I hangāia e rāotu he kuta rere (scooter), ā, i te mutunga iho, i eke rātou ki te tūranga tua rima. Arā anō i te Taite i tū te pakanga mō ngā Tau 5/6, ko Watene rātou ko Ngamiri, ko Hans, ko Te Akau. I hangāia e rātou he kuta rere (scooter) me tētehi mīhini horoi kākahu. Ohorere pai katoa au ki ngā tīma e rua! Tutuki pai tēnei o ngā kaupapa, ara mai anō he whakataetae a tērā tau. Te Wharekura o Kirikiriroa Sports Teams Expectations and Responsibilities

E mōhio ana te kura, e whā ngā rōpū / tāngata hei whakarite i ngā kawenga mō ngā kaupapa hākinakina o ngā tamariki. Koia nei ko;

1. Ngā kaiārahi
2. Ngā kaiwhakarite
3. Ngā kaitākaro
4. Ngā mātua

Heoi anō, kia rewa pai ngā mahi hākinakina, ahakoa he aha tōna momo, me mārāma tika ai te katoa ki ngā paearu me ngā kawenga haepapa o tēnā, o tēnā.

E whai ake nei ko ngā kōrero matua mō ngā paearu me ngā kawenga haepapa mō ngā tāngata katoa e whai wāhi ana ki roto i ngā whakaritenga hākinakina.

The kura acknowledges that there are 4 key groups / people critical to the provision of successful sporting experiences for our students. They are;

1. *The coaches*
2. *The managers*
3. *The players*
4. *Parents / caregivers*

It is important that each group, coach and manager is aware of the expectations and responsibilities of the other, so that the sporting season or tournament preparation and participation is smooth and enjoyable.

The following outlines the expectations and responsibilities of all those involved in taking and participating of all sporting teams.

Ngā Paearu me ngā Kawenga Haepapa

Expectations and Responsibilities

Ngā Kaiārahi - Coaches

Ngā Paearu mō ngā Kaiārahi:

1. Whakarite i ngā wheako me ngā akoranga e whakakipakipa ana i ngā kaitākaro katoa
2. Te whakatau i ngā kawenga haumaruru mō ngā kaitākaro otirā ngā kaimahi o te tīma
3. Te whakatauirā i ngā uara me ngā kawenga e hiahiatia ana
4. Te whakatairanga i te whanaketanga o ngā kaitākoro
5. Te whakaū i ngā mahi whakataetae ki roto i te wairua whakaute me te ngākau hūmārie



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6. Te karawhiu i ngā mahi mō te hemo tonu atu

Expectations for Coaches:

- 1. To prepare training and competing experiences that are fun and encourage participation*
- 2. To ensure that safe practises and conduct are practised by all*
- 3. To exemplify the desired values and conduct*
- 4. To acknowledge and celebrate the development of team members*
- 5. To instil a healthy competitive drive within respectful and humble practises*
- 6. To encourage team members to always give 100%*

Ngā Kawenga Haepapa o ngā Kaiārahi:

- 1. Ka whakarite ngā tahi me te kaiwhakarite i ngā wā whakaharatau, ngā rauropi, ngā wā tākaro, ngā wāhi hui etc*
- 2. Te ārahi i ngā tīma*
- 3. Te whakarite i te tīma tākaro, ngā kaiwhakawhitiwhiti hei ngā wā parakatihi, wā tākaro hoki*
- 4. Te whakatau i ngā whanonga o ngā kaitākaro – Hei ngā wā tika ka toro atu ki ngā mātua*
- 5. Kia mauri tau ai ngā kēmu. Ki te puta he take, me whai i te tukanga tika, waiho te amuamu me te wheke i ngā kaiwawao*
- 6. Ka tika te reo. Kaua e kohukohu.*

Responsibilities of Coaches:

- 1. With team managers, organise practise times, equipment, game times, meeting places etc*
- 2. Will coach players during practise times*
- 3. To name, field and rotate players and substitutes during practises and games*
- 4. Will manage the behaviour of team members during practises and games – Where required, parents may be asked to assist*
- 5. Ensure that games are played in the right spirit. If issues arise, follow the correct procedures for redress. Do not engage in conflict with officials or organisers.*
- 6. Coaches will not use inappropriate language at any time. Absolutely no swearing.*

Ngā Paearu me ngā Kawenga Haepapa

Expectations and Responsibilities

Ngā Kaiwhakarite - Managers

Ngā Paearu o ngā Kaiwhakarite:

- 1. Kia oti moata ngā whakaritenga**
- 2. Te tuku moata i ngā whakaritenga ki ngā mātua mō ngā whakaharatau, wāhi tūtakitaki etc**
- 3. Te whakautu i ngā pātai katoa i runga i te tika me te mōhio**
- 4. Whakatauiria i ngā uara me ngā paearu teitei o te tīma, me te tautoko i te kaiārahi hei ngā wā e tika ana**

Expectations of Managers:

- 1. Ensure all managerial and administrative requirements are competed in a timely manner**
- 2. Communicate early to whānau practise times, venues, meeting places etc**
- 3. Answer efficiently any questions whānau or organisers may have**



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4. *Respect and support where required, the role and responsibilities of the coach*
5. *Exemplify the desired values and behavioural expectations of the team*

Ngā Kawenga Haepapa o ngā Kaiwhakarite:

1. Whakarite ngā tahi me ngā kaiārahi i ngā wā me ngā wāhi whakaharatau me ngā rauropi
2. Whakaritea ngā wā hui, ngā wāhi tūtaki, rauropi me ngā kākahu hei ngā rangi ka tākorohia ngā kēmu e ngā tīma
3. Tuku moata i ngā whakamahukitanga
4. Ka tika te reo. Kaua e kohukohu.

Responsibilities of Managers:

1. *Organise with the coaches the practise times, venues and equipment*
2. *Organise meeting times, places, equipment and uniforms for game days*
3. *Communicate early and in an efficient manner to whānau, the practise days, times*
4. *Managers will not use inappropriate language at any time. Absolutely no swearing.*

Ngā Paearu me ngā Kawenga Haepapa

Expectations and Responsibilities

Ngā Kaitākaro - Players

Ngā Paearu o ngā Kaitākaro:

1. Whakapaua te 100% ki roto i ngā mahi parakatihi, tākaro me te whakawhanake i a rātou
2. Me ngana ki te whakapakari i a rātou pukenga, mōhiotanga me ngā waiaro ki roto i ngā mahi
3. Whakautehia ngā kōwhiringa o ngā kaiārahi me ngā kaiwhakarite
4. Whakatauirahia ngā uara me te taumata ka hiahiatia ai e te tīma
5. Mahi ngā tahi, whakaute hoki i ngā kaitākaro o te tīma, ngā hoariri me ngā kaiwhakahaere o ngā whakataetae

Expectations of Players:

1. *Commit 100% to practising, playing and improvement*
2. *Always work hard to improve their skills, knowledge and attitudes*
3. *Respect the decisions of the coaches and managers*
4. *Work hard to exemplify and demonstrate the desired values of the team*
5. *Be inclusive and respectful of their team mates, opposition and officials*

Ngā Kawenga Haepapa o ngā Kaitākaro:

1. Ka tae mai i te wā e tohua ana, me ngā rauropi tika
2. Ka ngana te aro ki ngā kōrero me ngā tohutohu o ngā kaiārahi me ngā kaiwhakarite
3. Ka whai i ngā tohutohu o ngā kaiārahi me ngā kaiwhakarite
4. Ka whakautehia ngā hoariri me ngā kaiwhakahaere ahakoa ngā tātai hei te mutunga o ngā kēmu
5. Ka tika te reo. Kaua e kohukohu.
6. Kaua e tautohetohe ki ngā kaiwawao

Responsibilities of Players:

1. *To arrive at practises and games on time and prepared*
2. *To pay full attention during training and games*
3. *To follow the directions of the coach and managers*
4. *Respectfully acknowledge their opposition and officials regardless of the outcome of the game*



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5. *Will not use inappropriate language at any time. Absolutely no swearing.*
6. *Will not argue with officials*

Ngā Paearu me ngā Kawenga Haepapa

Expectations and Responsibilities

Ngā Mātua me ngā Kaitiaki – Parents and Caregivers

Ngā Paearu o ngā Mātua:

1. Ki te tautoko i a rātou tamariki, te tīma, ngā kaiārahi me ngā kaiwhakarite
2. Whakahau i ngā kōrero akiaki mā te wairua hāpai
3. Tautoko i ngā kōwhiringa o ngā kaiārahi me ngā kaiwhakarite mā te tuku i a rātou ki te mahi i a rātou mahi
4. Whakatinanahia ngā uara me ngā whanonga tika
5. Whakaputaina te wairua whakaute, hūmārie ki roto i ngā aronga whakataetae
6. Whakatairangahia te kaha o te tākaro me te whanaketanga ake o te tamaiti me ōna hoa tākaro

Expectations of Parents:

1. *Support their tamariki, their team mates, coaches and managers*
2. *Ensure tamariki receive positive motivation during practises and games*
3. *Support the decisions of the coaches and managers by allowing them to do their jobs*
4. *Support the values and desired behaviour of the team*
5. *Exemplify the spirit of respectful and humble competition*
6. *Praise effort and development of their tamaiti and team*

Ngā Kawenga Haepapa o ngā Mātua:

1. Haria kia tae tika atu ngā tamariki i te wā tika ki ngā whakaharatau me ngā parakatihi
2. Tukuna ngā tamariki ki ngā parakatihi me ngā kēmu, me ngā rauropi tika
3. Whakawhitiwhiti kōrero me ngā kaiārahi, kaiwhakarite inā ka kore ngā tamariki e tae atu, ka tūreiti rānei ki ngā parakatihi me ngā kēmu
4. Ka tika te reo. Kaua e kohukohu
5. Whakautehia ngā kōwhiringa o ngā kaiārahi me ngā kaiwhakarite

Expectations of Parents:

1. *Ensure tamariki arrive to trainings and games on time*
2. *Ensure tamariki have all the gear required to play*
3. *Communicate with coach and management where tamariki will not be attending trainings and games, or will be late*
4. *Use appropriate language at all times. Absolutely no swearing*
5. *Will respect the decisions of the coach, managers and officials*

Note:

Where a team does not have a manager, expectations and responsibilities of the manager will fall to the team coach.

All fees and associated fundraising monies are to be paid directly to the office.

All teams, individuals, parents / caregivers and whānau of tamariki who wish to run any form of fundraising associated with or on behalf of a school sports team, or individual tamaiti as a part of a school sports team, must obtain permission from the kura before doing so. Requests to be sent to the tumuaki.



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If issues arise, they will firstly be raised with the coaches and / or managers directly in a discrete and respectful manner. If no resolution is arrived at, it will then be taken to the School Sports Leader or the identified Lead teacher of that particular sport. Following this, unresolved issues will then be handed to the tumuaki.

Disputes relating to officiating or competition organisation, rules or outcomes will only be tabled by team coaches.

- School Sports Leader / Identified Lead teacher will be a part of discussions before the official tabling of the dispute.
- Tumuaki will be kept informed

Any parent, caregiver or supporter / spectator who behaves in a way that is contrary to the expectations and responsibilities outlined above, will be in the first instance, asked to cease the inappropriate behaviour. If behaviour continues, they will then be required to not attend practises / games.

All tamariki, coaches, managers and parents / caregivers who wish to participate and support a kura sports team, acknowledge and understand that they ultimately represent the kura.
